College is *all* forms of high-quality postsecondary education—including certificates, credentials, and degrees.


College is for everyone: Today's students need education beyond high school to enter most careers.

Recent reports on the economy and workforce requirements project future job openings will disproportionately favor those who have some form of postsecondary education or training.


Georgetown University's Center on Education and the Workforce predicts by 2020, 65 percent of jobs in Florida will require a postsecondary education.



The economic benefits of postsecondary education and training for Floridians




Median Annual Wages in Florida by Education Level (2013)





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


What is college and career readiness?

- Academic preparation, knowledge and skills to enroll in college credit-bearing courses
- Do not need remediation (non-credit, developmental courses)
- Same level of knowledge, skills needed to enter workforce

High school GPA is among the strongest predictors of college success






College-Going Rates and Equity






FAFSA Completion Rates thru March 2015






High school grads eligible for Bright Futures

Success in the first year of college is the best predictor of whether or not a student will complete a degree



What is attainment?


Attainment is the number of 25-64 year olds with a degree or credential in our region.

- We are only at 38%!
- 48% of all jobs in 2018 will require certification or a 2 year degree



Why attainment?

• Individuals with higher levels of education earn more, are more likely to be employed, have a better quality of life and contribute more to their local and state economies



Target Populations

High school students transitioning to college and attaining college credit and industry certifications while still in high school

Adult learners currently enrolled but at risk of stopping out, those dropped out and those currently stopped out


65% have less than an associate degree

Veterans are a special subset of the adult learner population but with unique considerations

○ 60-70% of military personnel stay in the region

Success Over The Past Year

- 2% increase in regional attainment rate. That's 10,359 more degrees
